The intentional plane crashes in Lower Manhattan, the Pentagon, and Shanksville PA, caused devastation, panic, and hopelessness not just in the United States but also around the world.

The verses at the top of this letter are relevant to both 9/11/2001 and 9/11/2020.

"Quick to listen. Slow to speak. Slow to anger."

The context for James' words center upon another radical group bent on insurrection – the Zealots. This band of Jewish men relish in the destruction of the dreaded Roman Empire occupying the nation of Israel. They advocate violence in their attempts to push out the Caesar from the "Holy Land."

James believes there is a better way. He says that violent actions start from violent words flowing from a violent heart and mind. We, as Jesus-followers, are called to listen to others first then offer our view, if it is warranted.

As believers in the Resurrection, *our* future is set. This is our story. However, those who do not believe as we do have *their* story to tell. Being attentive to the concerns of others experiencing life without Jesus can lead to an opening when we can share our story of life with Him.
